

## SUGGESTED STREET TREES

All street trees should be straight with single trunks and a minimum caliper of 2-1/2" and insect/disease resistant

### LARGE TREES – Mature height of 50'+

- Plant only where planting strip is a minimum of 8' wide and no overhead utility lines.
- Also good for within owner's property.

**Emerald Ash Borer Warning:** While both White and Green Ash (*Fraxinus American* and *pennsylvanica*) have been successful street trees, both are infested in nearby communities by this destructive borer as we go to press. Therefore, we are suspending their planting.

Hackberry – *Celtis occidentalis*

Ginkgo – (males only) *Ginkgo biloba*

Thornless Honeylocust – *Gleditsia triacanthos* 'Moraine', 'Skyline', 'Shademaster'

Kentucky Coffeetree – *Gymnocladus dioicus*

Swamp White Oak – *Quercus bicolor*

Shumard Oak – *Quercus shumardii*

Baldcypress – *Taxodium distichum*

Crimean Linden – *Tilia euchlora*

Silver Linden – *Tilia tomentosa*

Elm – (Lacebark, 'Homestead', 'Pioneer') – *Ulmus spp.* Dutch elm disease resistant cultivars

### MEDIUM TREES – Mature height of 30' – 50'

- Minimum tree lawn 6' wide/no overhead utility lines

Hedge Maple – *Acer camestrum*

Paperbark Maple – *Acer griseum*

Ruby Red Horsechestnut – *Aesculus x carnea 'Briotii'*

River Birch – *Betula nigra*

Yellowwood – *Cladrastis kentukea*

Turkish Filbert – *Corylus colurna*

Ironwood – *Ostrya virginiana*

Callery Pears (improved over Bradford but be prepared to properly thin at least biannually for structure and air flow) – *Pryus calleryana* 'Aristocrat', 'Chanticleer', 'Redspire'

Littleleaf Linden – *Tilia cordata* 'Glenleven', 'Greenspire'

### SMALL TREES – Mature height under 30'

- Minimum tree lawn 4' wide
- Must be single trunk only

Serviceberry – *Amelanchier c x g* 'Autumn Brilliance', 'Cumulus', 'Code's Select'

Thornless Cockspur Hawthorn (thornless) – *Crataegus crus-galli var inermis*

Ohio Pioneer Dotted Hawthorn (thornless) – *Crataegus punctata*

Winter King Hawthorn (has thorns) – *Crataegus viridis* 'Winter King'

Crabapples (many, but avoid over planting) – *Malus spp.* 'Snowdrift' (white flowers) and *Zumi calocarpa* (pink to white flowers) are two very good ones

Tree Lilac – *Syringa reticulata* 'Ivory Silk', 'Summer Snow'
