

**MINUTES OF SPECIAL PERRYSBURG CITY COUNCIL MEETING**

**TO APPOINT CHARTER REVIEW COMMISSION MEMBERS**

**HELD MARCH 21, 2018**

The meeting was called to order by President of Council Jim Matuszak at 6:06 p.m. Council members present were: Deborah Born, Haraz N. Ghanbari, Jim Matuszak, Tim McCarthy, Jonathan Smith, Barry VanHoozen and Becky Williams (7). Also present were Karlene Henderson, Law Director, and David D. Creps, Clerk of Council.

The purpose of the meeting was to provide the candidates for the Charter Review Commission an opportunity to make a presentation to City Council, and for City Council to choose ten of the candidates, along with two alternates, for the Charter Review Commission.

The seven candidates with four or more votes were chosen: Aram Ohanian, Carol Shepard, Elizabeth Ravas, Jon Orser, Scott Anderson, Tim Monaco, and Will Harbauer.

The six candidates with three votes each were passed through to the second round of voting. The results of round two were as follows:

Mr. Gwyn was chosen as the eighth member.

The three candidates with three votes each were passed through to the third round of voting with the top two candidates being appointed to the Commission and the remaining candidate to be the first alternate. The results of the third round were as follows:

Mr. Nagle and Mr. Grayson were chosen as the final two members of the ten member Charter Review Commission. Ms. Weisenburger was chosen as the first alternate.

The final round of voting was for the second alternate position. The results were as follows:

Susan Rowland Miller – 4

Ms. Rowland Miller was chosen as the second alternate.

Mr. Matuszak thanked everyone for participating. Mr. Creps said that if we would like any issues on the November ballot, the latest it could be approved by City Council would be as an emergency measure on July 31, 2018. Mr. Gwyn requested that copies of the Bowling Green, Maumee and Sylvania city charters be made available for Commission members.
